

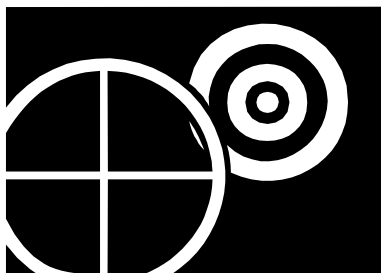

South Texas District Royal Rangers

Official Match Program

Eligibility

Entry in the tournament is limited to youth or commander who:

- a) Have completed the Daisy® 10 lesson shooting education curriculum. Copies of the 10-lesson education curriculum are available from:

- b) Are chartered and are from a current Royal Rangers chartered outpost.
- c) Are within the minimum age limits to attend Powwow and will not turn 18 before (for the boy's competition).
- d) Have qualified through a Section-sanctioned qualifying match.

Parental Permission

Each team registration packet contains a parental permission **form for each team member**. This form **must be signed** by the competitor's parent or guardian and returned with the other registration forms before the competitor will be permitted to participate in the Match.

Team Competition

- a) Teams are composed of five **(3) members**. All five (3) members scores will be counted. The team members can be a mixture from any qualifying age group up through the age of 17.
- b) There will also be commander competition (18 years of age and older). Teams are composed of three (3) members. All three (3) members scores will be counted. The same eligibility, chartering and shooting rules apply to the adults.
- c) Teams competing in the Section Championship Match shall be members of a local Outpost Championship Team and must be so designated by the Outpost for the Section Championships.
- d) The top two teams from the Section competition will be eligible to move up to the District Championship Match to be held at the Powwow. The third place team will be an alternate if one of the other teams cannot participate.
- e) The same boys in the team qualifying at the Section Match will be the team members for the District competition. No substitutions will be permitted. A shooter must represent the same Outpost in both the Section and District Championship Matches. No pick-up or Section all-star teams are allowed.

Conduct of the Tournament

Safety is the number one concern for all match officials, adult leaders, and competitors. Proper safety procedures will be enforced at all times. During competition, infractions will be noted and one warning will be issued to the shooter and his coach. A second infraction will result in the disqualification of the shooter.

Rules

The National Rifle Association **5-Meter BB Gun Rules** and the **Official Match Program** will govern all matches unless modified by a Match Director's Bulletin. Copies of the official match rules are available from:

Course of Fire

The BB gun match consists of 30 shots for record fired at 5 meters (16 feet, 4 ¾") in 3 stages with a 10-minute time limit for each stage as follows:

Match 1: 10 shots from the Prone position; NRA Rule 5.6

Match 2: 10 shots from the Standing position; NRA Rule 5.12

Match 3: 10 shots from the Kneeling position; NRA Rule 5.10

Target: The official targets will be either the *AR-4110* or the *AR-Silo*

Equipment

Official Guns: The official gun for the National Royal Rangers Shooting Education Program is the Avanti Champion Model 499. No other guns are approved or permitted. (Supercedes NRA Rule 3.1) This will allow for all teams to use the same equipment and help ensure an equal competition. All guns are to be unloaded and cased while being transported to the event and when being presented to the match officials. Only an adult should handle or transport any gun away from the firing line.

Gun Modification: See NRA rules 3.2, 3.3, and 3.7 (excluding (a) referring to receiver sights), 3.11, 3.13, and 3.18.

Spotting Scopes: The use of telescopes or binoculars by competitors or coaches to spot shots is permitted.

Stocks: Factory installed stocks must be used. Alterations are governed by NRA rule 3.4. Coloring of stocks is permitted providing such coloring does not violate rule 3.18.

Ammunition: Only Daisy® Precision Ground BBs shall be used for all Section and District Championship Matches. Each team will be responsible for their own BBs. BBs are subject to inspection to ensure they are unaltered Daisy BBs. (supercedes NRA Rule 3.17)

Gun Inspection: All air guns used in competition at the District Championship Matches must be presented to the Match Referee for inspection prior to the start of competition. Upon approval by the Match Referee, each gun will receive an official match seal. Guns not bearing this seal will not be permitted on the firing line.

Eye Protection: All competitors and other personnel forward of the ready line must use shatterproof shooting glasses or other similar eye protection devices.

General Information

- a) The match will be conducted as detailed in the Daisy-10 Lesson guide with the exception that a commander should be the spotter / loader for each boy vs the 1, 2, 3 rotation. This will improve safety and keep us on schedule.
- b) Commanders are responsible to keep their boys under control at all times. We are very concerned for their safety and cannot afford to have them be distracted and unsupervised.
- c) Each team will be responsible to provide their own supplies, which includes but are not limited to shooting mats, safety glasses, spotting scope, support rolls, and BBs. The district or section will provide targets.
- d) The targets will have 10 bulls eyes on each sheet and the shooter will use a different bulls eye for each shot.
- e) There will be two shots allowed at the beginning of each round for each shooter to verify sightings.
- f) You will need to bring any snacks that your boys may want. Cold water will be provided.
- g) We will be awarding medals to the top 3 Teams based on total aggregate score. We will also recognize (ribbons) the top shooter in each age group (highest total score) and the top shooter in each position.
- h) To help cover the cost of the medals and supplies there will be a \$35.00 registration fee **per team**.
- i) Any Daisy open sight is acceptable on the official guns. Slings are optional.
- j) The official uniform of the day will be jeans (**long pants, no shorts**) and RR T-shirt. Team T-shirts will also be acceptable and encouraged. Please avoid the full Para-military attire. Camo pants and T-shirt are ok but please be sensitive to the current Orange/Red National alert status.

The Official Team Registration and Shooters Permission / Release of Liability forms will be included in the mailed packet. ***Each shooter must have a signed liability Release Form before they will be allowed on the firing line - NO EXCEPTIONS.***
